

Training for PAS Volunteers and Community Groups: Local Place Plans

WHAT WE DO AND WHY WE DO IT

PAS has a commitment to developing the skills and experiences of its volunteers and community groups by providing interactive and relevant skills training. Local Place Plan (LPP) training provides a broad understanding of LPPs, as detailed in the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019, and their role within the planning system.

WHO IS IT FOR?

This course is provided for PAS volunteers at all levels, from students to retired professionals, who have an interest in or are involved in the delivery of PAS local place plans and community engagement. It is also for community groups wanting to develop LPPs in their local area. The training provides a broad overview of LPPs, their role within the development plan process and a suggested approach to preparing a Local Place Plan. Interactive activities also allow for a sharing of knowledge between participants.

- General understanding of the key characteristics of Local Place Plans and how they fit within Development Planning.
- An increased awareness of your role in supporting or enabling the delivery of a Local Place Plan.
- A better understanding of the context of LPPs in relation to community engagement approaches and the Place Principle.
- Opportunity to connect and network with other volunteers / communities in your area and share knowledge of LPPs and community engagement.
